The MARPOL Convention is enforced through international cooperation, port state control inspections, and flag state regulations to ensure that ships comply with these pollution prevention measures.

UNDERSTANDING MARINE POLLUTION

- Air & Marine Pollution from ships include any deliberate discharge of pollutants into the sea either by negligence or intentionally.

SIMA has the responsibility of preventing and responding to marine pollution from ships



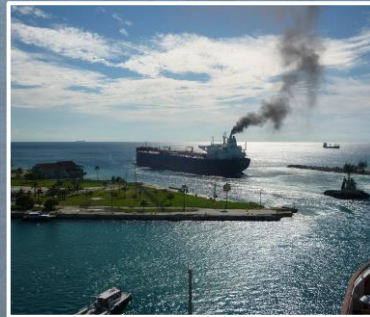

SHIP OPERATORS RESPONSIBILITIES



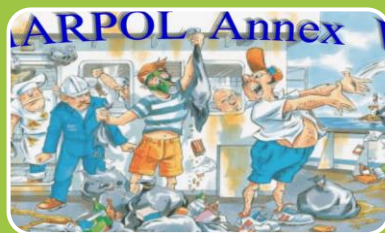
Ship Oil Pollution Emergency Plan (SOPEP)

- Developing & Implementation of ship-specific procedures and plans to prevent oil Pollution.
- This includes oil spill response plan (SOPEP), oil record books, and pollution response equipment.



Sewage Management Plan (SMP)

- Managing sewage for discharge as per applicable standards
- This includes procedures for collection, treatment and discharge of sewage waters from ships



Garbage Management Plan (GMP)

- Developing & Implementing of Garbage Management Plan for their ships which include no discharge of plastics
- This includes procedures for collection, storage and disposal of garbage from ships



Ship Energy Efficiency Management Plan (SEEMP)

Develop and implement a SEEMP - document that should be tailored to the specific ship's needs and continuously updated to reflect changes in technology, regulations, and operational practices.

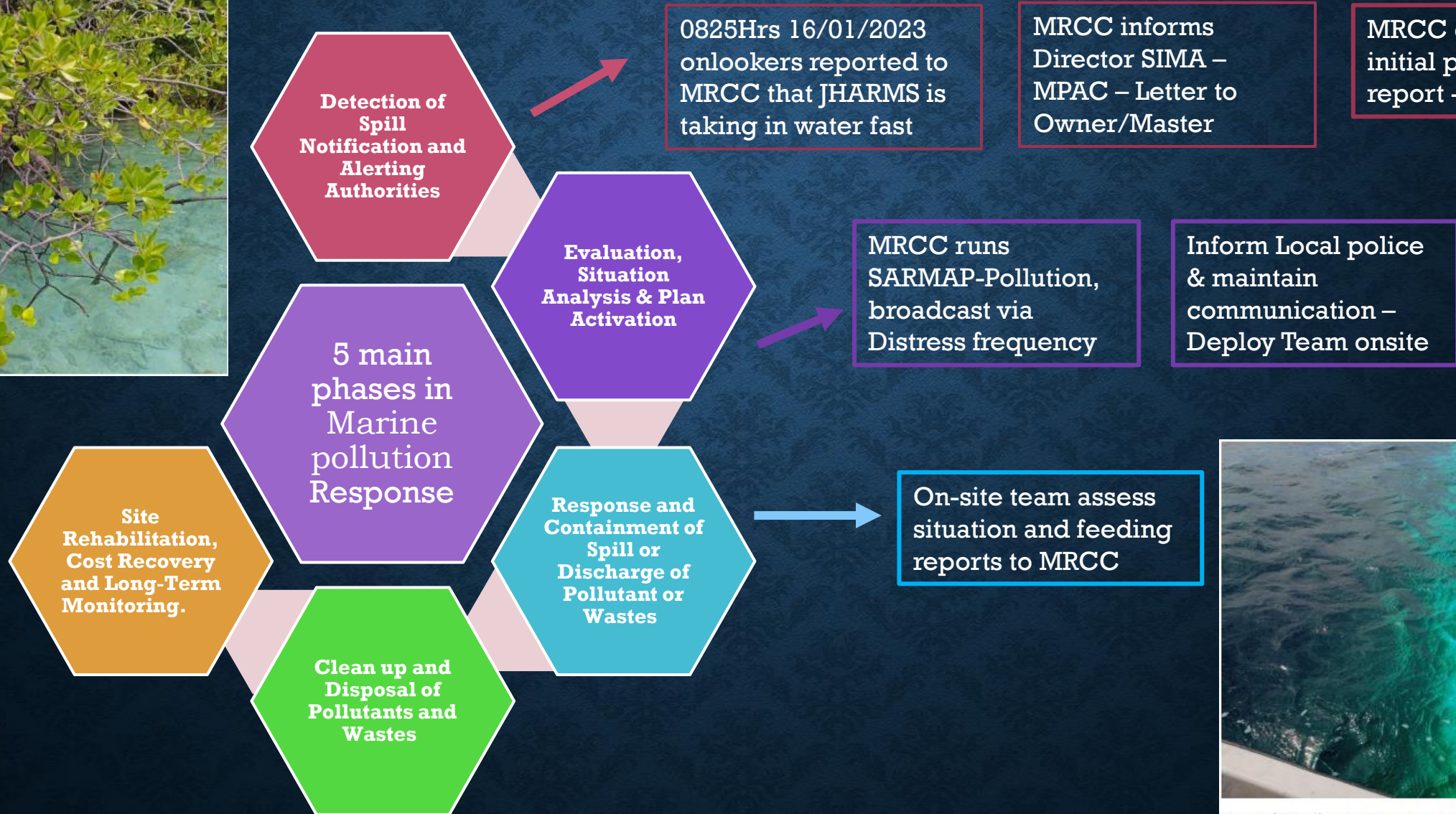


Figure 6 showing day 1 on-site assessment water quality

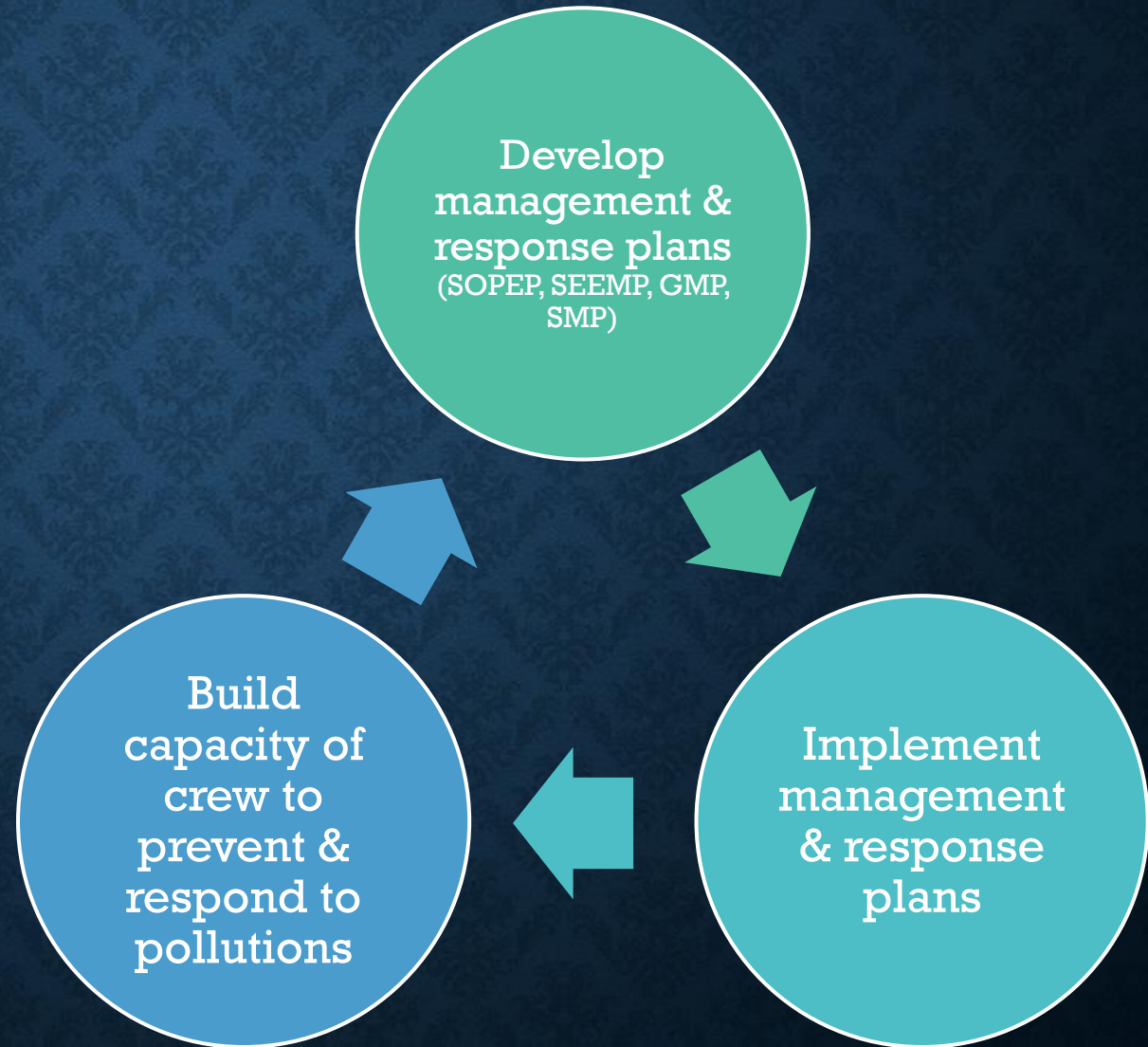
