DURING BAD WEATHER

On a drifting boat caught in bad weather, the only way to minimize the risk of capsizing is to-

- Reduce speed and steer into the wind.

- Distribute load onboard in order to obtain safest possible balance.
- Deploy sea anchor.
- If waves getting bigger and boat starts to swamped everybody should get ready to use their floating devices.
